





# The Spring Exhibition in May 2024

The days are getting longer and Spring is on its way, which means that our Spring Exhibition is on the horizon! The exhibition opens on **Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May and runs until Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> May** in the Bedford Suite at Sutton Town Hall. Receiving Day is on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May. Exhibition schedules will be sent out at the beginning of April.

Unfortunately, the costs of hiring the Town Hall are rising, so in order to cover our costs, it has been necessary to increase the hanging fees. Fees for 3D work have also been brought into line with 2D work. The new fees are shown below:

It is not too early to prepare your entries and make arrangements for framing if required.

At the last Receiving Day, there were a number of entries which were incorrectly framed or did not have adequate strings and fitments for framing. We did manage to amend some entries, but this was time consuming and we are unable to do so again. Any work presented on **Receiving** Day on 3<sup>rd</sup> May, which is incorrectly framed or does not have the correct hanging fittings, will be rejected.

Some members new to exhibiting their work have also asked for some guidance so a brief guide to framing is included in this newsletter. Committee members will be happy to help and advise and will be available at the **Art days on 17**<sup>th</sup> **February, 16**<sup>th</sup> **March and 20**<sup>th</sup> **April held at the Methodist Hall in Sutton Coldfield.** 


Please note that annual membership fees of £30 should always be paid in October or November after the AGM. The Society rules state that if fees are not paid by the 31st of January then we will assume that the member has resigned. Therefore a reminder is sent out in the middle of January. We are always grateful when members let us know if they are letting their membership just pause for a while. You are always welcome to re-join at a later time.

#### **Guide to Framing for SCSA Exhibitions**

All 2D work should be presented for exhibition in a suitable frame.

The only exceptions to this rule are browser works, textile works and canvas works where the edges have been painted.

Frames should be robust enough to withstand hanging and be in good order. Potential purchasers will be deterred by a worn, damaged or untidy frame.




The backing board should be held in place with metal tabs and framing tape to ensure that it is secure.

Framing tape also prevents dust and insects gaining access to glazed framed work.

Framing tape is available online or from retailers such as Hobbycraft, Cass Art or Vesey Gallery. Masking tape is not strong enough for securing backboards as it dries and comes away from the board.

All 2D work whether framed, glazed, unglazed or unframed canvas should be strung for hanging using D-rings and either framer's cord or wire. The D-rings should be fixed no lower than one-third of the way down the sides. Please ensure that the cord or wire is robust enough to support the weight of your work. D-rings and wire / cord are available from hardware shops and on line.

Many frames available online or from shops have hanging fittings such as metal clips attached to the back of the backboard. Unfortunately, we cannot use these with our existing exhibition fittings so d-rings and cord or wire are still required, as per the image shown.



If you are having difficulty in finding the correct framing equipment or are unsure how to complete the framing, please contact a member of the SCSA Committee who will be able to advise you. Alternatively, there will be Committee members at the Art Days who can help.
